Dear Parents/Guardians,

The <u>Dominic Murray Sudden Cardiac Arrest Prevention Act</u> is a new law as of July 1, 2022. This law requires schools, students, and parents/guardians have information on sudden cardiac arrest risks, signs, and symptoms. Please note that sudden cardiac arrest in children and youth is rare. The incidence of sudden cardiac death (SCD) on the playing field is 0.61 in 100,000.¹

Sudden Cardiac Arrest (SCA) is an emergency that happens when the heart suddenly stops working. SCA can cause death if not treated immediately, and even with treatment death may occur. Immediate treatment is cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) and use of an automatic external defibrillator (AED). All public schools must have a staff member trained in the use of CPR and AED in school and at all school athletic events.

Preventing SCA before it happens is the best way to save a life¹. Both your family health history and your child's personal history must be told to healthcare providers to help them know if your child is at risk for sudden cardiac arrest. Ask your child if they are having any of the symptoms listed below and tell a healthcare provider. Know your family history and tell a healthcare provider of any risk factors listed below.

The signs or symptoms are:

- Fainting or seizure, especially during or right after exercise or with excitement or startled
- Racing heart, palpitations, or irregular heartbeat
- · Dizziness, lightheadedness, or extreme fatigue with exercise
- Chest pain or discomfort with exercise
- · Excessive shortness of breath during exercise
- Excessive, unexpected fatigue during or after exercise

Student's Personal Risk Factors are:

- Use of diet pills, performance-enhancing supplements, energy drinks, or drugs such as cocaine, inhalants, or "recreational" drugs.²
- o Elevated blood pressure or cholesterol
- o History of health care provider ordered test(s) for heart related issues

Student's Family History Risk Factors are:

- Family history of known heart abnormalities or sudden death before 50 years of age
- Family members with unexplained fainting, seizures, drowning, near drowning or car accidents before 50 years of age
- Structural heart abnormality, repaired or unrepaired
- Any relative diagnosed with the following conditions:

- Marfan Syndrome- aortic rupture
- Heart attack at 50 years or younger

SCA in students at risk can be triggered by athletic activities. To decrease any chance of SCA in a student, the <u>Interval Health History for Athletics</u> must be completed and signed by a parent/guardian before each sports season unless a physical examination has been conducted within 30 days before the start of the season. This form has questions to help identify changes since the last physical examination or health history was completed. School personnel may require a student with health or history changes to see a healthcare provider before participating in athletics.

Finally, the law requires any student who has signs and symptoms of pending SCA be removed from athletic activity until seen by a **physician**. The physician must provide written clearance to the school for the student to be able to return to athletics.

Regulations Governing the Education of ELLs

"Regulations Governing the Education of ELLs (154-2.3(k)(2)) designate that a school district or Board of Cooperative Educational Services (BOCES) may seek permission on an annual basis from the Commissioner for an exemption from the professional development requirements where there are fewer than thirty (30) ELLs enrolled or ELLs make up less than five percent (5%) of the district's or BOCES' total student population as of such date as established by the Commissioner. A district or BOCES seeking permission for such exemption shall submit to the Commissioner for approval an application in such format and according to such timeline as may be prescribed by the Commissioner, that includes evidence that as a part of the required professional development clock hours prescribed by Part 80 of this Title, all teachers, level III teaching assistants and administrators receive training sufficient to meet the needs of the district's or BOCES' ELLs, in language acquisition, including a focus on best practices for co-teaching strategies and integrating language and content instruction for ELLs and evidence that as a part of the required professional development clock hours prescribed by Part 80 of the Title, all Bilingual and ESOL certified teachers receive training, sufficient to meet the needs of the district's ELLs, in language acquisition in alignment with core content area instruction, including a focus on best practices for co-teaching strategies and integrating language and content instruction for ELLs."

RELIGIOUS EXEMPTIONS UNDER TITLE IX OF THE EDUCATION AMENDMENTS OF 1972

Title IX of the Education Amendments of 1972 ("Title IX") is a federal law that prohibits sex discrimination by educational institutions receiving financial assistance from the federal government, including USDA. Although this prohibition applies to a wide array of public and private schools at the K-12 and the college/university level, the law includes some exceptions, including one permitting an institution to be exempt on religious grounds if there is a conflict between Title IX and a school's governing religious tenets.

Below are two basic questions and answers about Title IX Religious Exemptions. If your institution decides to seek USDA assurance of an exemption, please be sure to do so consistent with regulations (link below), and contact us at CR-INFO@usda.gov if you have questions:

1. Are religious educational institutions required to submit a written request to USDA in order to claim a Title IX Religious Exemption?

No. USDA regulations do not require a religious educational institution to submit a written request for a Title IX exemption in order to claim that exemption.

If, however, a religious educational institution wishes to seek USDA recognition of their religious exemption, it may do so through a written request under USDA regulations (7 CFR 15a.205). The written request seeks USDA assurance of exemption from applicable sections of USDA's Title IX regulations. Those that have neither sought nor received prior written assurance from USDA may still invoke their exemption after USDA receives a Title IX discrimination complaint or initiates Title IX compliance efforts. Any action taken by USDA in a specific case will take account of all relevant facts and legal requirements, including, where applicable, Title IX's Religious Exemption, the Religious Freedom Restoration Act, 42 USC 2000bb et seq., and any other applicable exemptions.

2. If an educational institution wishes to seek USDA assurance of religious exemption from Title IX provisions, where should that written request be sent?
