

Camp Turner campers and staff benefit from 50 years of priest's service

Camp Turner, the Diocese of Buffalo's summer camp for boys and girls ages 7-16, is approaching its 92nd summer. Throughout this time, camp has moved sites, been developed and enhanced, added activities, evolved new programs, seen staff move on to do great things in their communities, and welcomed lifelong campers as the next generation of staff.

There is one person who can testify firsthand to both the many changes and the constancy of its mission over the years. That person is Father John Kwiecien, currently serving at Most Precious Blood Parish in Angola. Out of 92 summers, Father Kwiecien is about to embark on his 50th.

Father Kwiecien began his career at Camp Turner while he was still in the minor seminary as the assistant nature counselor, learning from those before him and teaching those who came after. That program still bears his mark. Father Kwiecien is best known for the musical talent that he brings to ministry, enhancing the liturgies, campfires, and mealtimes with both stringed instruments and voice.

time. Many remember his seminal role as St. Nicholas each summer during Christmas in July. Still others remember his role in the wilderness canoe trips down the Allegany Reservoir.

For the last 13 summers, Father Kwiecien has had a special function in guiding the mission of Camp Turner as its chaplain. He is a special adviser to both administration and staff. From as long as anyone can remember the mission of Camp Turner has remained the same: "Honor God in the children confided to your care."

These words have been the marching orders for staff and alumni for generations. Father Kwiecien supports the camp in living these words each summer. Staff who help campers discover the presence of God in themselves, in each other, in the staff,

and in all of God's marvelous creation, is perhaps the best example of how the mission of Camp Turner is lived.

The entire Camp Turner family of campers, camper parents, staff and alumni would like to express its appreciation for Father Kwiecien's 50 years of service to the camp. He continues to honor God in his care for those at the camp and with his service to camp.

There is still space to sign up your camper for a 2015 camping session. All activity areas will be returning for 2015 including camper favorites like horseback riding, archery, arts & crafts, games-in-the-woods, and the low-ropes course. New activities have been added recently, like four square, pickle ball, wood shop, and and 9-square-in-the-air.

St. Joe's sponsors readiness, recreation program


